Henry was born in Coaldale, AB on October 17, 1927 to Jacob and Susanna Dueck. He married Alice Helen Redekop and they had 5 children together. Henry spent most of his career as a missionary in South and Latin America with several mission agencies. Henry and Helen retired to Winnipeg, MB where he died Nov 4, 2007.

- 1969 to Costa Rica for Spanish language study
- 1970 Dec 1981 H and H teaching in Seminario Mennonite de Teologia in Montevideo and working with SA churches
- 1976 H and H work in Bienenberg Bibelschule in Switzerland
- 1977 Studies henry in OMSC in Ventnor NJ and Helen in Princeton Theological Seminary
- 1978 return to Montevideo, Uruguay
- 1982 1983 H and H studies in Princeton Henry MTh and Helen MAan and visiting churches for COM
- 1983 1985 Co pastors of the Charleswood Mennonite Church in Winnipeg
- 1985 1989 Teachers in Universidad Evangelico Boliviano. Santa Cruz and working with the Bolivian Menno Churches with returns to Uruguay for classes
- 1989 1990 Teaching in Columbia Bible College and visiting churches

- 1990 1992 Teaching in Seminario Bautista in Cochabamba Bolivia and returns to Santa Cruz and Montevideo
- 1993 Eight months assignment in South America, Colombia, Ecuador, Bolivia, Paraguay and Uruguay
- 1994 1996 two winters in Mexico teaching in Steinreich Bibelschule and pastors of Anuahac Church

- 1998 In South America Henry presents a documentary of Uruguay Story and both present first Curriculum at Consulta in Paraguay

- 2000 return to South America and Guatemala Curriculum and church visits
